The Brown County Commissioners met in regular session on Wednesday, July 5, 2023, at 1:15 PM., in the Brown County Courthouse meeting room with members Chairman Buddy Small, Dennis Bauer and Jeremiah Dailey present. Also present were Brown County Clerk (BCC) Travis Hobbs and Brown County Highway Superintendent (BCHS) Kenneth Turpin.

Chairman Small acknowledged the Open Meeting Act posted near the entrance to the Meeting Room.

Those in attendance rose and stated the Pledge of Allegiance.

Small moved to approve minutes from the June 20, 2023, Commissioner meeting as written and officially recorded in Commissioner Book 23. Dailey seconded. Roll Call: All three Ayes, motion carried.

Brown County Weed Superintendent (BCWS) Scott Erthum presented his weed report.

BCHS Turpin gave a report on the road department projects.

Discussion was held regarding the replacement or repair of the Wagoner bridge. BCHS Turpin presented his findings on the ownership of the Bridge. He was unable to find any definitive records of the bridge in question.

The Board discussed a county ordinance relative to Nebraska State Statute 39-1812. The Board will ask the County Attorney to draw up a proposed ordinance for the next meeting.

Small moved to approve Resolution #2023-35 transferring \$5,000.00 from Miscellaneous General Fund within the General Fund to the Reappraisal Fund. Bauer seconded. Roll Call: All three Ayes, motion carried.

Small moved to approve payment of the claims. Dailey seconded. Roll Call: All three Ayes, motion carried.

The Board acknowledged a correspondence letter from the Nebraska Crime Commission relating to the annual Jail Inspection.
