The Brown County Commissioners met as the Board of Equalization (BOE) in regular session on Tuesday, August 2, 2022, at 5:00 P.M., Brown County Courthouse meeting room with Chairman Buddy Small, Reagan Wiebelhaus and Dennis Bauer present. Also present were Brown County Clerk (BCC) Travis Hobbs, Brown County Assessor (BCA) Terri Van Houten and Brown County Attorney (BCAA) Andy Taylor.

Chairman Small acknowledged the Open Meeting Act posted near the door.

Small moved to approve the minutes of the regular July 19, 2022 BOE meeting and the July 5, 2022, July 18, 2022, July 22, 2022 Special BOE meetings as written and officially recorded in Commissioner Book 22. Bauer seconded. Roll Call: All three Ayes, motion carried.

Bauer moved to approve the July 7, 2022 Special BOE meeting as written and officially recorded in Commissioner Book 22. Wiebelhaus seconded. Roll Call: Wiebelhaus Aye, Bauer Aye and Small Abstain, motion carried.

Small moved to approve the July 5, 2022 Regular BOE meeting and the July 25, 2022 Special BOE meeting as written and officially recorded in Commissioner Book 22. Bauer seconded. All three Ayes, motion carried.

BCA Van Houten discussed an exemption application that was denied by a doctor and two that have sold homes disqualifying them.

Wiebelhaus moved to approve the denial of exemption applications and authorize Chairman Small to sign. Bauer seconded. Roll Call: All three Ayes, motion carried.

BCA Van Houten presented the Board with an update to a tax roll correction #45 that was approved at the July 19, 2022 Commissioner meeting.

Wiebelhaus moved to update tax roll correction #45 to replace the correction made at the previous meeting. Bauer seconded. Roll Call: All three Ayes, motion carried.

BCA Van Houten informed the Board that no changes in uses or owners of cemeteries.
